# 116) Policing Matters

PCSP Webber apologised to members for missing the July meeting. She then went on to report the crime figures for July and August –

July – 29 crimes, high. Includes 5 bilking from Eye Green petrol station, 4 incidents involving the same address and 2 incidents criminal damage. August – 16 crimes. These include an assault at McDonalds, 2 garden shed break-ins, theft at Van Hague, 2 drug related crimes, 2 arson attacks at the rear of the Community Centre and 5 bilking for Eye Green petrol station. The police have been working with PCC to move further CCTV cameras at the rear of the Community Centre but there is no funding available. That area does look very nice.

The police have been trying to put up barriers at the back of the Community Centre field but have had difficulty in finding who owns the footpath – both Ward Councillors assured PCSO Webber that Highways own it.

Councillor Sanders told the meeting that he believes it is up to the police to police the rural area effectively and that CCTV is not always the answer. The crime figures are rising and we have been told that the police resources will be put into areas that have problems but this doesn't appear to be happening in Eye. The Clerk will write to both the Area Commander and the Police Commissioner asking them to channel more resources into Eye.

Concern was also raised at the time it takes to investigate an incident even when the public do provide CCTV footage and that CCTV can just move "wrongdoers" from one area to another.

# 117) Items for City Councillors

Concern expressed at the PCC contractors cutting of grass around the village. Often not being cut for 3 weeks and always looks a mess. There is a meeting with Ward Councillors, the contractor and the Chairman of the Parish Council in early September to check what is in the contract and to ensure this is being fulfilled.

# How long has this contract to run?

A map is available showing the areas Amey are responsible for. The McDonalds roundabout is overgrown and a buddleia is growing in the road.

A resident has cut the vegetation over the footbridge.

The brambles along the footpath of the Cut at Tintern Rise have been causing concern and the Ward Councillors have received complaints. Amey Highways will now be rectifying this.

The travellers at the A16/A47 roundabout will be moved on. The entranced area was to be "trenched" to prevent further access.

The smoke from burning near to Chancery Lane is being dealt with by Councillor Brown through the City Council and the PCSOs have also been informed as this can cause problems for traffic on the A47.
