**106) Policing**

Inspector Kieran Mylchreest – Northern Sector Inspector

Members told him of their disappointment of lack of follow-up/call backs. One member had called in on 999 to report anti-social behaviour late at night and the operator told him to call back on 101.

There has been damage on the Recreation Ground, to the pavilion, dug outs ripped up, broken glass over the field

The Inspector told the meeting that the police deal with calls on a priority basis.

Manor Farm Community area in Eye is patrolled more because of problems there.

The Panels meeting have been suspended due to lack of interest from the public but it was pointed out that they had been poorly advertised. The team led by Sergeant Hills are holding regular meeting in the villages – members pointed out that for Eye this ought to be in the Leeds hall as they used to be and not in the Van Hague Coffee Shop. There are 5 X 8 teams of officers with 6 officers per shift with 11 PCSOs – PCSOs leaving are currently not being replaced but recruitment is ongoing for PCs. There are 4 PCs for this area as well as our designated PCSO who is back from holiday. There are of course holidays/sickness to be taken into account.

Statistics show that 24% of Peterborough residents live in poverty –

Mr Goodsell said that our school is on par with the City deprivation, not of a rural school

Eyebury Quarry are very concerned as they suffered a break in last night with items stolen but lots of damage to documents. The inspector explained that it is up to private companies to deal with their own security.

### **113) Eye Primary School – Report**

The annual summer fete was a success with £2,500 being raised. Sports Day has been changed – there will be winners and losers.

School closes on 17<sup>th</sup> – tomorrow. Some year groups will be full next year. Some new staff will be from out of the area.

Letter received from the Head teacher requesting financial assistance for new playground equipment. It was proposed by Mr Booth and seconded by Mr Smart that £2,500 be granted from the Charitable Trust – set up in October 2014. All agreed. Mrs Di Parkin to be approached to join the committee of the Larkfleet Community Fund

#### **114) Cemetery – Report**

The clerks is continuing to investigate how to have the unauthorised memorial removed from the cemetery. Mr Jackson will look at sending a solicitors letter. The “Morgue” Building is falling into disrepair and the Cemetery Committee will look at it. Funding for repairs will be looked – “The Jack Paxton Charitable Trust” may be able to assist.

#### **115) Allotments – Report**

Land – Rearrangement proposals from Smith Gore

Mr Jackson told the meeting that normally a payment would be made when such a protected tenancy is given up.

The Parish Council also want to protect the building envelope of the village.

It was proposed by Mr Jackson, seconded by Mr Booth that The Parish Council does not give up this land. All agreed. The current tenants are to be approached to review their rents – this should cover the costs of the allotments.

#### **116) Transport, Roads and Footpaths**

Speed awareness signs – Mr Butterwick is currently moving the signs around. On whose insurance is this?

It was agreed to stay with the same terms and conditions as the City Council uses for theirs and order the signs from the supplier with the cheapest quote.

The A16 night time road closures have resulted in lorries coming trough Eye Green. There is a large pothole on the bend near to Eyebury Farm causes traffic to move out into the middle of the road.

Someone is spraying dog poo with what looks like orange paint – if it is paint it will remain when the dog poo has gone!

The bollards on the High Street near to number 117 are down.

#### **117) Leeds Hall, Recreation Ground and Amenities**

The interior walls have been redecorated as has the front wall and gloss near to the notice-board.
