# Minutes of a meeting of Eye Parish Council in the Leeds Hall, High Street, Eye on Thursday 21st July 2016 at 7pm.

Consultation with the public until 7.10pm - 8 present.

Issue of the A47 roadworks raised. No advance signage and is causing problems for residents getting in and out of the village at peak times. Why can't the work be done at night? Lorries from the tip coming through the village which is not helping and that road is being used as a rat run. This will be discussed with the Ward Councillors when they arrive.

Green Road allotment holders disagree with the minutes of last month that say the allotments are all taken. Several are overgrown and not being worked. Mr Holmes and Mr Smart will meet the tenants there next Wednesday to look at the site.

Eye Green Nature Reserve – Darren Sharpe, Natural & Historic Environment Manager, Peterborough City Council and James Collingridge, Amey Partnership Manager

The Wildlife Trust are not continuing with the management of the Nature Reserve from 5<sup>th</sup> September and the City Council will take this over to manage and to improve the site. Unfortunately, no representative form the Wildlife Trust available to attend this meeting. They will engage with the community and take advice on management from the Wildlife Trust. There has been a lack of funding and a lack of investment. The tall poplar trees have been surveyed and so need work on them and some will need to be felled but replacements will be planted. The site is of archaeological interest and Natural England are to visit.

The bridges are to inspected by specialists – one at the rear of the site is low in the water and any remedial action will be taken. The Health and Safety Officer has visited twice. By 5<sup>th</sup> September all the signs will be updated and in place and in different languages. Amey will be doing the general grounds work. Difficult in some areas to get the mowers in. Question – what about the lack of grass cutting now ie Hodney Road. It has been a very quick growing year. Hodney and Crowland Road Bridges will be cut back. There will be a Management Plan for the Nature Reserve which will be shared the Parish Council and the Wardens – the current wardens will remain. They will be invited to meet with representatives in the next couple of weeks on site. At the moment there are brambles/trees and bushes which encroach onto the footpaths. These are cutback every year and a volunteer group can help with this. The work the wardens do is very much appreciated. The intention is to achieve high standards and preserve the characteristics of the area. Dog fouling continues to be an issue – improved signage with the bins being emptied regularly – please report when the bins need emptying. The Warden from Star Pit told the meeting that bags of dog poo do get left on trees. The wardens should work alongside the professionals for the future generations. Ponds and habitats will be preserved.

The new nearby development of 55 houses does affect that area – can the CILL formerly S106) money generated be spent on the Nature Reserve. This can only be spent on capital investment eg the Bridges infrastructure and not on day to day revenue expenses. The land drain at that site will be looked at by the Health & Safety Officer.
