Could the sign be fitted on a different part? Have tried to obtain quote for church wall repairs – problem is the partial road closure is off putting.

Emergency lights all repaired.

Pavilion – Looking very good, cleaned, new lounge flooring and outer doors and rails painted.

North Level IDB Open Day – Very interesting and informative.

Mr Smith has been involved in looking after the church clock. It is wearing and now needs further work and expertise. The clerk will advise them of Bidda and Lakfleet funding.

Eyebury Quarry Liaison meeting report – Quarrying ended. Over 5,000 trees to be planted. The area will not be accessible to the public.

Biifa – 10 years' landfill left. The leachate is not permitted to drain into the sewers under current planning permissions. Encourage us to apply for Biffa Awards funding. ie Leeds Hall Roof, Church for the clock repairs

Dogsthorpe Tip will finish soon but the Garden Waste Section and Recycling Section will remain open. Everything else will go to the incinerator.

The planters through the village are currently being replanted for the winter.
