#### 17) Speed watch -Paul Cooper, Newborough

Mr Cooper is the Co-ordinator for the scheme in Newborough. They have 14 volunteers – none are Parish Councillors.

Speeds of 10%+2 are reported to the police. A letter is then sent by the police. Higher speeds and repeat offenders receive a police visit.

The idea of the scheme is to educate people into slowing down and has been going in Newborough for 12months.

3% found speeding in Guntons Road, 7.5% in Thorney Road.

Volunteers go out in pairs for one hour at a time.

Newborough currently share equipment with Yaxley and Farcet, each has it for two weeks. Newborough would like to buy equipment and share with Eye so each village has it every fortnight. The cost is £2,800.
