The walkway in Tintern Rise is owned and maintained by Highways England.

The grassed area in Westminster Gardens is owned by Green Space Energy and they have been requested to look after it.

Buglife have now withdrawn from looking after the Nature Reserve so it remains in the ownership and care of Peterborough City Council.

City Councillors have walked around the Nature Reserve with Officers and the fishing stations and pathways will be cut back.

The Memorial Bench for Bill Green will be provided and installed by the City Council at the bottom end of Pershore Way, looking out at the lake. The Parish Council will provide a plaque to go on it – Mr Short will organise this.

There is a litter bin at the entrance to Star Pit.

Larkfleet have confirmed they are nearing completion on the Open Space area at their development in Thorney Road, Eye. The play equipment was incorrectly installed and this has now been rectified. One grass cut is completed each side of Thorney Road and it is then the responsibility of the maintenance company.

The Weight Restriction at Van Hague has been agreed, signage for each side is awaited.

Edgerly Car Sales, Peterborough Road – Mobility Scooters etc are having to go into the road because of vehicles blocking the pavement. PCSO and Enforcement to be advised.
