Minutes of Meeting of Eye Parish Council in the Leeds Hall, High Street, Eye on Thursday 16th January 2020 at 7.00pm

Consultation with the public until 7.10pm

Also present: Police & Crime Commissioner Ray Bisby, Sergeant R Ellison, PCSO Courtney-Hunt, Mrs Parker and 3 members of the public.

Mrs Parker told the meeting that the Model Railway Society understood how and why the Parish Council voted concerning the land at Hodney Road but was disappointed with the short letter she received from the clerk and would like more detail to explain to her committee. It was agreed that the clerk would endeavour to send a fuller explanation with members assisting with the wording.

1) Apologies for Absence

2) Police and Crime Commissioner

Councillor Ray Bisby explained he is also a City Councillor for Stanground and was recently promoted from Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner. The role is up for re-election in May.

His role is to listen to the public and to liaise with the Chief Constable.

50 extra police officers have been recruited for Cambridgeshire and are undergoing training. They will then go out double patrolling initially.

Between November and April 2021, 62 new officers will be recruited, funded by the government.

The Community Safety Partnership works alongside the Commissioner and is funded by him. He also works with the criminal justice system and agreed that this needs reviewing.

The various police forces work together to benefit all ie Anti-terrorism, armed response, modern day slavery, drugs and to improve buying power for each of the police forces.

The police do need information from the public and the 101 service was discussed and members all agreed that the current system does not work very well and doesn't encourage people to call in.

The commissioner explained that all calls are prioritised and that mental health nurses are assisting with the calls.

Being in the rural area Eye does not see as many police officers around as it would like. Our designated PCSO covers a large area and lots of villages and often is dealing with an incident or called to assist elsewhere ie on a murder etc. Special Constables are deployed when possible but are volunteers.

Eye has a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme and Speedwatch.

10) Cemetery –Report

Unfortunately parts of the cemetery have become flooded over the last few weeks due to high rainfall. The area was piped and the area is being monitored. Path to be looked at.

A new cremated remains area for 200 is required and an area to the side of the mortuary seems the best place. The current path leads down to it. Quotes to be obtained for new fencing 12m X 20m and the area will require some landscaping. The BT gate isn't being locked and the corner post has fallen over – BT to be contacted to rectify this.
