This is a fairly new charity with Cate being the only paid staff member as the co-ordinator supported by a team of volunteers.

They are looking for support from Parish Councils in the rural areas and supports vulnerable people. Each Parish Council that joins provides a Board Member/ Trustee and assists in identify key volunteers, who would be DBS checked, from the community. Referrals can be made by individuals/family/friends. The charity provides low level support and doesn't reproduce what other organisations provide. Concern expressed about the cost to the Parish Council – suggested over £4,000pa The Parish Council will use the next Eyescan issue to inform the public of the scheme and invite volunteers to come forward and then decide on the way forward.
