122) Planning

Applications:

REF:22/00813/FUL Erection of a single storey dwelling at 39 Crowland Road, Eye, PE6 7TP

The Parish Council note that there are 7 objections to this application and object to the application on the following grounds – Very narrow driveway, the loss of trees and mature hedge row and concerns over drainage. Surface storm water from the properties along here go into the drains in Green Road where there have been issues with flooding.

REF:22/00974/HHFUL Construction of detached garage at 15 Crowland Road, Eye, PE6 7TN. No comments.

REF:22/00985/HHFUL Demolition of conservatory and erection of single storey rear extension at 34 Westminster Gardens, Eye, PE6 7SP. No Comments

REF:22/00932/OUT Outline application (with all matters except access reserved) for the demolition of the existing bungalow and the erection of 6 new chalet bungalows with an associated access road, care parking and amenity space at 112, High Street, Eye, PE6 7UY. We would like the planning authority to ensure that there will be adequate parking on the roadside within the development. The exit from this may affect the current traffic calming in the High Street

Decisions:

REF:22/00495/FUL Construction of 2 x detached dwellings with associated parking and amenity space at Land to Rear of 73 High Street, Eye, PE6 7UX. Refused

REF:22/0440/FUL Erection of a part two storey, part single storey extension to extend the first floor of the dwelling and create a post office at ground floor level at 16 Peterborough Road, Eye, PE6 7YB. Withdrawn

123) Allotments

2 vacant plots with a 3rd coming up. All in reasonable order. Waiting list has been cleared. Item in next Eyescan advising of vacancies.

Still concerns with burning on the allotments but this is being done as per the agreement agreement and National Association of Allotments guidelines.

Complaint made of horse tethered at Hodney Road allotment area and not being looked after properly. Not there with Parish Councils permission, no idea who the horses belong to. Any concerns for the animal's welfare to be reported to the RSPCA.

Members met with PCC Officer to discuss chicanes down Eyebury Road, a quote is awaited. The general plans for Eyebury Road could affect this as 2 chicanes are due to be moved as well as the cycle lane.

Email received from Mike Freeman, PCC that the Neighbourhood portion of CIL funding can be used to develop a Neighbourhood Plan. Noted.

NALC funding of upto £18,000 also available

Meeting held on 5th July was useful and members attending recommended that the Parish Council take this forward – all agreed

Clerk to arrange a meeting for early September to set timetable for public consultation and printing advertising to coincide with next issue of Eyescan.

Mr Taylor attended a zoom course on this run by CAPALC and he has the login details

Seems to be the way forward and can help with the Neighbourhood Plan, giving access to ordinance survey maps, assisting with cemetery layout, village boundaries and much more.

The cost is £234pa - all agreed to go ahead with this
