It was agreed to the above with the additional condition that the event is held on the Recreation Ground.

Request for funding from the Good Neighbours Scheme – request refused.

Should the Community Centre require funding for The Warm Hub then they are invited to reapply to the Parish Council.

207) Planning

Applications

REF:25/01330/FUL Change of use of Agricultural Barn to B2/B8 use at Northolm Farm, Crowland Rd, Eye Green, PE6 7TT. Discussed at last month's meeting but further information sought. The Parish Council Object – the building may have asbestos, concern with vehicle movements with the 7.5tonne limit on the road and the road to Masons Bridge is in a very poor state and further heavy vehicle movement will only exuberate this.

REF:25/01378/TRE Consultation on application for Notice or Works to Tree(s) by a Preservation Order – raise willow tree crown 10-12m from ground(1200003/TPO) at 78 Hodney Road, Eye, PE6 7YJ. No objections, asked for a map of all TPOs both here and in the village.

REF:25/01376/HHFUL Loft conversion with dormer windows at 34 Lindisfarne Road, PE6 7XH. No comment.

REF:25/01293/FUL Installation of metal roller shutter – (retrospective) at 53 High Street, Eye, PE6 7UX. Object as in Conservation Area so should be inside the premises.

208) The Peterborough Local Plan – new sites have now been submitted and one or more are in Eye, therefore Eye Parish Council are invited to comment by 19th December 2025.

Country Park shown near the A47- access to unsure. Interactive map available to identify areas – Coun Ormston to send the link through to discuss next month..

209) Cemetery

Tree Survey report for consideration. Mr Smith will look at and will advise as to what work can be done “In House” and 2 further quotes will be required for the major work.

Email advising of government funding available to support the renovation of war memorials. Ours is generally in good order but the kerbing around left hand side needs remedial work, there is also candle wax in the granite – clerk will ask local stonemason for advice.

210) Allotments – Report

The second skip is due at the weekend, which will clear all the vacant sites and they can then be relet.

A request for the large shed on the bottom allotment to be used as a communal shed for tools etc has been made. The allotment holder will be asked for agreement to this but the allotment holders will need to insure their own property.

211) Neighbourhood Plan - -update

Good progress is being made by our consultant, no further costs from him anticipated, in line with the change suggested by the Parish Council Officers. The changes are more with re-wording of policies and presentation rather than actual content.

It is expected that this will be ready to submit back to the City Council in the New Year.
